
THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING. The Kingship of Christ gives life a new and transcendent orientation. His Kingship extends into this world, but it is not of this world. Following World War I, and on the occasion of the 1600th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, Pope Pius XI established the feast in 1925 with the encyclical "Quas Primas". There he emphasized the need for civil society to attain "just freedom, tranquility, discipline, peace, and harmony".

In the liturgical calendar of 2025, Sunday, November 23rd, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe; also known as the Feast of Christ the King. This feast is celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year and reminds us that Christ is the true King who must reign in our hearts.

In the year 325, the first ecumenical council was held in the city of Nicaea, in Asia Minor. There, the divinity of Christ was defined against the heresies of

Arius: "Christ is God, Light of Light, true God from true God."

VIVA CRISTO REY! We might be tempted to translate 'Viva Cristo Rey' as 'Long live Christ the King', but that wouldn't be quite right, these words are not the expression of a wish, such as when we say, 'God save the King!' rather they are a statement of fact, a statement of faith, 'CHRIST THE KING, HE LIVES!' https://www.english.op.org/torch/viva-cristo-rey/



IX WORLD DAY OF THE POOR. Pope Leo XIV has declared Sunday 16th November 2025 to be the ninth World Day of the Poor. In his message the Holy Father urges us to recognize those experiencing poverty as "witnesses to a strong and steadfast hope, precisely because they embody it in the midst of uncertainty, poverty, instability and marginalization. The poor cannot rely on the security of power and possessions; on the contrary, they are at their mercy and often victims of them. Their hope must necessarily be sought elsewhere."

"It is my hope, then, that this <u>Jubilee Year</u> will encourage the development of policies aimed at combatting forms of poverty both old and new, as well as implementing new initiatives to support and assist the poorest of the poor. Labor, education, housing and health are the foundations of a security that will never be attained by the use of arms. I express my appreciation for those initiatives that already exist, and for the efforts demonstrated daily on the in-


