First Eucharist is an exciting and awesome sacrament. The Holy Family Community focuses this weekend on making First Holy Communion celebrations personal, parish-community oriented and family-centered. This sacrament is a celebration of children being welcomed to the Table of the Lord for the very first time, and formally being welcomed into its faith community. It connects each child to the presence of Jesus Christ and allows them to experience yet another step of deeper commitment to the Catholic Christian way of life. The Sacrament of Eucharist is a sacred meal of thanksgiving, a memorial of Christ's death and resurrection. The Second Vatican Council teaches us that “the other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesial ministries and works of the apostolate are bound up with the Eucharist and are directed toward it.”

The Eucharist is the center and high point of the Church's sacramental life. The celebration of first communion is a time for all of us to think about the communion we share at every Mass. It is a time for us to pause and think about how we receive the presence of Jesus under the form of consecrated bread and wine, as well as the witness we give to those around us. We are all invited this weekend to reflect on our children who receive the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist for the first time.

It's also a noble thing to remind ourselves:

Who is Jesus Christ? Jesus Christ is the Son of God who was made man, died on the Cross and rose for our salvation.

What is the Most Blessed Sacrament? The Most Blessed Sacrament is the true Body and true Blood of Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine.

What is Holy Communion? Holy Communion is receiving of Jesus under the appearances of bread and wine.

Who can receive Holy Communion? Holy Communion can be received by everyone who does not have a mortal sin.
