SAINT PA-DRE PIO & **POOR** SOULS IN **PURGATO**-RY. Padre found devo-

Pio had a protion to the souls in purgatory and was frequently visited by them seeking his intercession for prayers, especially Masses. He saw praying for the deceased as an act of mercy and a way to help "empty purgatory with our prayers," and his own suffering was partly offered for them. He encouraged others

to pray for these souls and taught that this practice not only helps the departed but can also **strengthen the** connection between the living and the dead. During his devotion to the Poor Souls Padre Pio experienced the following: 1) Frequent visitations: Padre Pio stated that as many souls of the dead came to him for help as there were living people. They would appear to him in a state of suffering, asking for prayers and Masses. 2) Prayer and Mass as a way to help: He once received a soul who explicitly asked for a Mass to be said for his liberation from purgatory. Padre Pio emphasized the spiritual weight of the Mass, which can shorten the time souls spend in purgatory. 3) Offering his own suffering: Early in his priesthood, he felt a strong desire to offer himself to God as a victim for the poor sinners and the souls in purgatory. 4) Encouraging prayers for the deceased: Padre Pio's message was a call to action for the living, urging them to pray for the departed. He famously declared, "We must empty Purgatory with our prayers".

This Week's Message:

The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of Rome. It was built during Constantine's reign and was consecrated by Pope St. Sylvester I in the year 324. This feast was later made a universal celebration in honor of the basilica called 'the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world' (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput) as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.
