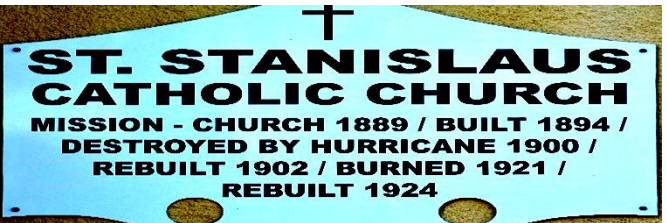

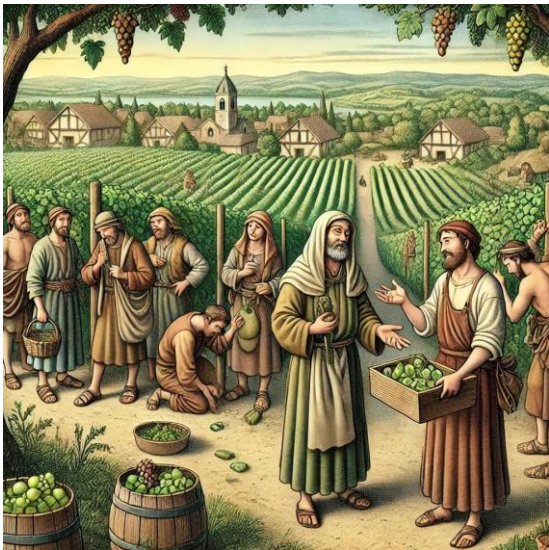

A reflection on Matthew 20:1-16a

What is most striking about the landowner is the relentless way he himself goes out to find laborers, his constant willingness to hire the ones who are still standing there, and his desire to pay them a full day’s wage. Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven is like this landowner. God takes the initiative in seeking us out. God chooses us despite our utter unworthiness. And God is so lavish in his self-gift to us. To love the kingdom of heaven is to love this landowner and the way he acts. The temptation is for us to measure our life by what we imagine we deserve. But in truth, God is always giving us far more than we deserve, even in calling us to labor in his kingdom! Let us “*seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near,*” because for us, “*life is Christ.*”

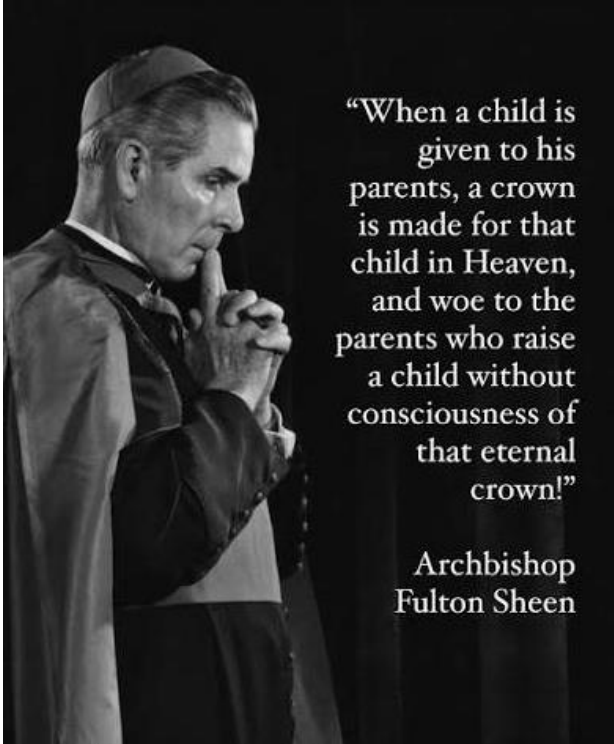

MARK YOUR CALENDAR QUICKLY BECAUSE ARCHBISHOP SHEEN WILL BE ELEVATED TO THE ALTARS THIS WEEK ON THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 24TH, 2026.

The beatification will take place at The Dome at America's Center, St. Louis, MO. Procession will start at 1:30 PM Central Time and the beatification Mass at 2:00 PM. The Catholic Television of Mother Angelica EWTN will carry complete live coverage. But if you do not have cable, you can watch the ceremonies entirely for free online on the [EWTN YouTube Channel](#) . Presiding Prelate will be Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle (representing Pope Leo XIV).

The **miracle** approved for Archbishop Fulton Sheen's beatification is the recovery of James Fulton Engstrom, a boy born stillborn in September 2010 at the OSF Saint Francis Medical Center, Peoria, He had no detectable pulse for 61 minutes. His parents, **Bonnie and Travis Engstrom**, prayed for the intercession of Venerable Fulton Sheen, to whom the family had a devotion. And the baby came back not only to life but to full recovery; with no lasting physical or mental

impairment. Now this child of the miracle is 16 years old. In July 2019 this miracle was approved by Pope Francis. And this act of the Holy Father was the last requirement that needed to be met in the process before beatification. Saint Augustine’s saying is so clearly true, that “*material goods, unlike those of the spirit, cannot belong wholly and simultaneously to more than one person.*”

The same house, the same land, cannot belong completely to several people at once, nor the same territory to several nations. And herein lies the reason of that unhappy conflict of interests which arises from the feverish quest of those earthly possessions.

On the other hand....the same spiritual treasure can belong in its entirety to all men, and at the same time to each, without any disturbance of peace between them. Indeed, the more there are to enjoy them in common the more completely do we possess them. The same truth, the same virtue, the same God, can belong to us all in like manner; and yet none of us embarrasses his fellow-possessors. Such are the inexhaustible riches of the spirit that they can be the property of all and yet satisfy the desires of each.

Indeed, we possess a truth so completely only when we teach it to others, when we make others share our contemplation; only then do we truly love a virtue when we wish others to love it also; only then do we wholly love God, when we desire to make him loved by all. Give money away, or spend it, and it is no longer yours. But give God to others, and you possess him more fully for yourself.
