REFLECTION ON THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

October is a month dedicated to many things in the Catholic Church. It is Respect Life Month, where we pray in a special way for an end to abortion and for the dignity of all human life to be upheld in our laws and in our hearts. October is also a month of special devotion to our Blessed Mother. There are two important Marian dates in October. October 13 is the anniversary of the sixth and final apparition of Our Lady of Fatima, and what is known as the "Miracle of the Sun," when the sun appeared to change color and dance in the sky before tens of thousands of witnesses in

1918.

And October 7 is the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast commemorates the Catholic naval victory against the invading Turkish armada at the battle of Lepanto in 1571. Despite being vastly outnumbered, the small Christian fleet turned back the much larger Islamic fleet. Pope St. Pius V attributed this to Our Lady's intercession in response to the many rosaries that were prayed for victory.

Apart from the Holy Mass itself, the rosary is without a doubt the most iconic form of Catholic prayer. In films, if a director wants to show that a character is Catholic, all they have to do is place a rosary in their hands. In a round-about way, I can attribute my own conversion to the rosary. <u>podcasters.spotify.com</u>

You see, I was raised without any particular religious upbringing, but I developed an interest in history as a teenager, especially in material culture — things like historical clothing and tools and instruments. So when I began to date a Catholic girl in college, I wanted to learn about the history of her religion and the material culture associated with Catholicism. And I was especially curious about the iconic rosary. None of the Protestant denominations I was familiar with had anything like it.

So I did what one did to research a topic in the age before Google. I bought a book. When I sat down to read this book on the rosary, I thought I was going to be reading about the history of a material object, a religious accessory. But I quickly learned that the rosary is much more than a string of beads. It's not an object. It is a prayer. And that's what this book I had purchased was about: praying the rosary.....
