No dances during Lent.

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at age 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-60. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which Fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other acts of penance or charity.
4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.

EASTER TRIDUUM - HOLY TRIDUUM - HOLY THREE DAYS



Holy Week

The Easter Triduum begins on Holy Thursday with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, is continued through Good Friday with the Celebration of the passion of the Lord on Holy Saturday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday. The Season of Lent ends on Thursday of Holy Week. Then the Church remembers the Death and Resurrection of Jesus during the Easter Triduum. These three days are the most important time of the Church year. Mass of the Lord's Supper - On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper and that Jesus gave himself in the Eucharist. We recall that Jesus chose His apostles to serve and lead the Church. Remembering that Jesus washed their feet at the Last Supper, the priest washes the feet of members of the congregation. Holy Thursday is a special day for all priests since it is a day to mark the beginning of the ordained priesthood. The evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday is a beautiful and joyful celebration. During the singing of the Gloria, the Church bells are rung and then remain silent until Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday night. Because Holy Thursday is a feast day of the Blessed Sacrament, there is a procession of the Eucharist after the Mass to an altar of repose set up for the occasion. Then the main altar is stripped bare. Good Friday - On Good Friday we remember the death of Jesus. According to an ancient custom, Mass is not celebrated on this day or before the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. The celebration of the Lord's passion and death takes place in the afternoon. There are three parts to the liturgy of the day; the Liturgy of the Word; the Veneration of the Cross; and Holy Communion with Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday. Holy Saturday and Easter Vigil - Holy Saturday the Church meditates on the suffering and death of Jesus. Then the Church gathers to celebrate the Easter Vigil. The celebration of the Easter Vigil should take place at night, beginning after nightfall or ending before the dawn of Sunday. The Easter Vigil has four parts: The Service of Light; the Liturgy of the Word; the Liturgy of Baptism; and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Easter Sunday - joyous celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection marked by processional carrying of Paschal Candle before the Masses. **DON'T FORGET TO LIMIT YOUR EATING AND ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON GOOD FRIDAY.**

There will be no CCE classes on April 9 and 16. Our last CCE class will be on April 23. Reconciliation and First Communion Rehearsal will be on Saturday April 29 at 9:30 am. First Communion will be on Sunday April 30 at the 8:00 am Mass.

Blessing of Easter Baskets will be on Saturday April 8 at 9:00 am. There will be an Easter-egg hunt for the children on Easter Sunday after Mass. Children must bring their own baskets. If you would like to contribute plastic eggs (filled with candy or prizes—no chocolate, please), bring them and leave in box at back of church before Mass on Easter.

This Week's Message:

“Acclaimed as son of David, as the one who brings salvation (*Hosanna* means ‘Save!’ or ‘Give salvation!’), the ‘King of glory’ enters his City ‘riding on an ass’. Jesus conquers the Daughter of Zion, a figure of his Church, neither by ruse nor by violence, but by the humility that bears witness to the truth. And so the subjects of his kingdom on that day are children and God’s poor, who acclaim him as had the angels when they announced him to the shepherds. Their acclamation, ‘Blessed be he who comes in the name of the LORD’, is taken up by the Church in the ‘Sanctus’ of the Eucharistic liturgy that introduces the memorial of the Lord’s Passover.”
