The Lord said to Magdalen: "Why are you weeping?' and soon after, on the same day He appears to St. Peter.



My dear people, Magdalen and Peter are the two privileged persons to whom the Victor of Golgotha appears first, to bring them the first joyful and happy Easter message. They had repented of their sins; they had been absolved by Our Savior Himself. They had made their Easter Confession!

Brethren, with Peter and Magdalen we have sinned; but we, too, have repented of our faults in our Easter Confession. Hence, I say to you, in the Name of the Risen Savior: "A very happy and joyous and blessed Easter to you! May the joys and blessings and graces of this holy season be yours in the fullest measure!"

Should there be anyone in our midst who has not as yet complied with this most sacred duty, I would like to ask such a one, in the name of the Savior, to come soon during this holy Easter season to the feet of Our Lord and ask His pardon and absolution in an humble Easter Confession.

This Week's Message:

"The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace, 'so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.' Justification consists in both victory over the death caused by sin and a new participation in grace. It brings about filial adoption so that men become Christ's brethren, as Jesus himself called his disciples after his Resurrection: 'Go and tell my brethren.' We are brethren not by nature, but by the gift of grace, because that adoptive filiation gains us a real share in the life of the only Son, which was fully revealed in his Resurrection."
