FOR CATHOLICS, LABOR DAY IS MORE THAN JUST A DAY OFF —it’s a moment to pause and reflect on something deeper: the dignity of work and the God-given value of every worker. As Pope Saint John Paul II wrote in *Laborem Exercens*: “*Work is a good thing for man... not only because it is useful, but because it expresses and increases his dignity.*”

Catholic Social Teaching on Labor

Our faith has a rich tradition of supporting workers and their rights. Here are a few key principles to reflect on:

- Dignity of Work: Work is not just a task—it’s a way to live out our God-given purpose.
- Rights of Workers: Fair wages, safe conditions, reasonable rest, and the right to organize are basic human rights.
- Option for the Poor: We are called to consider how our choices—personal and societal—impact the most vulnerable.

(Dd you know that Saint Paul the Apostle pictured here was also making tents?)
Working with Purpose - Finding God in Your Daily Labor. As Catholics, we believe that **work is not just about making a living**—it’s a way to serve. Whether you’re caring for children, managing a household, filing papers, studying, or building homes, your work has meaning when it’s done with love.

St. Paul reminds us: “Whatever you do, do it from the heart, as for the Lord and not for others.” —Colossians 3:23
Even small, unnoticed tasks are important—because they matter to God.

Ask yourself today:

- Who am I serving through my work?
 - How can I offer today’s tasks to God?
- Am I using my gifts with love?

Working with purpose doesn’t always mean changing careers—it means **inviting Christ into what you’re already doing**. When you do this, even the **ordinary becomes holy**.

Prayer to Saint Joseph: Saint Joseph, model of workers, help me to work with patience, diligence, and humility. Pray for those without jobs and those treated unjustly in the workplace. The smallest thing, a disturbance in the atmosphere, a change of temperature, is enough to destroy life. The frost of spring, an unusual drop in temperature on a May evening, and the harvest is destroyed. The same is true for the most important and fragile part of man: his divine life.... The Christian community offers an environment that shows men how to live according to the ways of Christ, who assists, supports, and illuminates the heart of man.

Just as I do not invent my life, I do not invent my faith but instead receive it as it is. Likewise, I do not have to invent my prayer, but I receive Christ’s prayer, born of the Spirit of God and already existing in the community of his children. The older people introduce the little ones to the life of Christ; the previous generations educate and admit the new generations into this movement of prayer born of Christ and supported by the fact that he is waiting for us.... No doubt, it is often the young who recall and demand the essential things, and the fervor of the new members revivifies that of the older ones. But it is also from the fidelity of the older members that the newly arrived draw truth, or else lose it....

The Church is able to offer me the prayer of Christ and to welcome me into a living environment, a community, where this prayer can originate and grow. Thus, it is no more a matter of choice for a “member” to live attached to his organism or to separate himself from it. A man is Christian only if he receives within himself the life that comes through communion in faith and the prayer of his brothers.

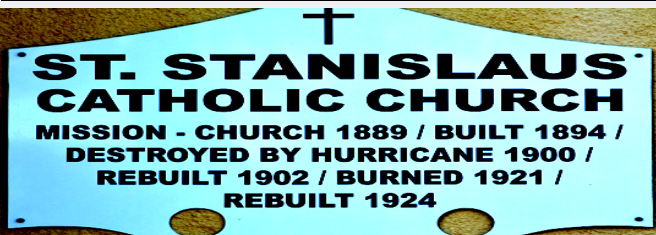
