That day, beloved children, on which Christ, the Savior of the world, for the first time appeared to the gentiles, is be venerated with a most holy honor by us also.... For that day is not past in such a way that the power of the work which was then revealed should be past as well.

O God, Who on this day didst reveal Thine only begotten Son to the gentiles by the leading of a star; mercifully grant, that we who know Thee now by faith, may be brought to the contemplation of the beauty of Thy majesty.

JANUARY 6TH - OR THE CLOSEST SUNDAY - A FEAST DAY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD.

On one hand the **manifestation** of Jesus to the Gentiles, on the other hand **commemoration** of the **Three Kings** (Three Wise Men, Three Magi) from the East – **Caspar**, **Melchior**, and **Balthazar** – who followed the Star of Bethlehem to pay homage to the newborn Jesus. They brought gifts symbolizing their faith and respect: **myrrh**, representing human suffering; **frankincense**, symbolizing divinity of Jesus; and gold, emphasizing the royal dignity of the Child Jesus. On this day a Blessing of the Chalk may take place, so the Faithful may mark their doorways with the letters **C ❖ M ❖ B ❖ 2026** (**initials of the Three Kings and the current year**).

This is how the Three Kings are often described: **Caspar (or Gaspar)**, who has brown hair and a brown beard (or no beard!) and wears a green cloak and a gold crown with green jewels on it. He is the King of Sheba. Caspar represents the Frankincense brought to Jesus. **Melchior**, who has long white hair and a white beard and wears a gold cloak. He is the King of Arabia. Melchior represents the Gold brought to Jesus. **Balthazar**, who has black skin and a black beard (or no beard!) and wears a purple cloak. He is the King of Tarsus/Macedonia and Egypt. Balthazar represents the gift of Myrrh that was brought to Jesus.

According to tradition, after adoring the Christ Child and returning to their countries as described in Sacred Scripture, the Three Kings later met and were baptized by Saint Thomas the Apostle during his evangelizing labors in the East and also consecrated by him as priests and bishops in service of the King of Kings. Shortly before their death they met together, and they died together too (within 24 hours or so). When **Saint Helena** a mother of **Emperor Constantine the Great** found their burial place in 4th century, she brought their relics to Constantinople. But Helena didn't get to enjoy her find for long: The emperor gave it to the Milanese bishop Eustorgius, who embedded it in a marble sarcophagus and had the reliquary transported to Italy on an ox cart. And the bones lay there for over seven centuries, until **Emperor Frederick I**, known as Barbarossa, besieged Milan in 1162. At his side was the Cologne Archbishop Rainald von Dassel. When the Italian city of Milan finally fell, von Dassel asked for the Three Kings' remains as spoils of war. Since then the relics of the Three Kings are in the present Cathedral of Cologne, Germany.

This day the Church is joined unto the heavenly Bridegroom, since Christ hath washed away her sins in Jordan; the wise men hasten with gifts to the marriage supper of the King; and they that sit at meat together make merry with water turned into wine. Alleluia.

The Magi reveal that our search for truth leads to worship. Our response to the Father’s offer of salvation must be that of the Magi: “To offer gold is to proclaim Christ’s Kingship, to offer incense is to adore his Godhead, and to offer myrrh is to acknowledge his mortality” (Saint Odilo of Cluny). Creation responds as well: “When the king of heaven was born, the heavens knew that he was God because they immediately sent forth a star; the sea knew him because it allowed him to walk upon it; the earth knew him because it trembled when he died; the sun knew him because it hid the rays of its light” (Saint Gregory the Great). Coming to know the Son of God changes our lives: “Copartners in the promise of Christ Jesus through the Gospel,” we are led home by another way.

This Week's Message:



*"The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that 'the full number of the nations' now takes its 'place in the family of the patriarchs,' and acquires *Israelitica dignitas* (is made 'worthy of the heritage of Israel').".*"
