We will need a head-count for the caterer, so make sure you RSVP by July 19th (or sooner if possible) on the sign-up sheet at the back of the church!



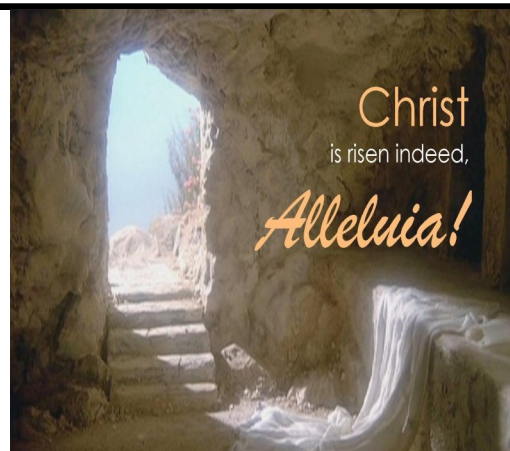

SAINT PIUS X WAS THE ONE WHO EXTENDED THE PRACTICE OF FIRST COMMUNION TO YOUNGER CHILDREN.



He was a remarkable Pope who left a lasting impact on the Catholic Church. Born Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto, he became Pope in 1903 and was known for his humility, devotion, and commitment to reform. According to tradition his father was a Polish immigrant named Krawiec, who changed his last name in Italy in order to get a job. This way Krawiec became Sarto meaning Tailor.

Any Catholic who received First Communion in second grade can thank Pope St. Pius X, who extended the practice to younger children, saying that "Holy Communion is the shortest and safest way to heaven."

His decree on the age for First Communion allowed children aged 7 and older to receive the Eucharist; the practice had been reserved for children at least 12 to 14 years old.

Saint Pius X's legacy inspires us to deepen our faith, seek spiritual renewal, and strive for holiness. May his example guide us, especially our First Communion children, on our spiritual journey.

And here we have some questions from the catechism: **What is Holy Mass?** Holy Mass is a sacrifice of the New Covenant in which Jesus offers Himself for us to His Father under the appearances of bread and wine. **What is Holy Communion?** Holy Communion is receiving of Jesus under the appearances of bread and wine. **Who can receive Holy Communion?** Holy Communion can be received by everyone who does not have mortal sin.

A prayer that you may not forget is an **Act of Contrition:** O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee. I detest all my sins because of Thy just punishment, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who are all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

This Week's Message:

"By means of touch and the sharing of a meal, the risen Jesus establishes direct contact with his disciples. He invites them in this way to recognize that he is not a ghost and above all to verify that the risen body in which he appears to them is the same body that had been tortured and crucified, for it still bears the traces of his passion. Yet at the same time this authentic, real body possesses the new properties of a glorious body: not limited by space and time but able to be present how and when he wills; for Christ's humanity can no longer be confined to earth, and belongs henceforth only to the Father's divine realm. For this reason too the risen Jesus enjoys the sovereign freedom of appearing as he wishes: in the guise of a gardener or in other forms familiar to his disciples, precisely to awaken their faith."
