MONTH OF MARCH IS DEDICATED TO SAINT JOSEPH



.... the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man," and the Church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection. The Church encourages us to be devoted to Saint Joseph because he was a model in the heroic practice of all the virtues. The example of virtuous living that he gave in the exact fulfillment of the duties of his state of life is worthy of our reflection. The most popular act of devotion to Saint Joseph is praying the Litany of St. Joseph, and here is a prayer written by **Pope Leo XIII** known by its Latin title: *Ad te beate Ioseph, in tribulatione nostra...*

To thee, O blessed Joseph, do we come in our tribulation, and having implored the help of thy most holy Spouse, we confidently invoke thy patronage also.

Through that charity which bound thee to the immaculate Virgin Mother of God and through the paternal love with which thou embraced the Child Jesus, we humbly beg thee to graciously regard the inheritance which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood, and with thy power and strength to aid us in our necessities.

O most watchful Guardian of the Holy Family, defend the chosen children of Jesus Christ; O most loving father, ward off from us every contagion of error and corrupting influence; O our most mighty protector, be propitious to us and from heaven assist us in our struggle with the power of darkness; and, as once thou rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril, so now protect God's Holy Church from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity; shield, too, each one of us by thy constant protection, so that, supported by thy example and thy aid, we may be able to live piously, to die holy, and to obtain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

THIS YEAR IN 2025, ON MARCH 5TH WE BEGIN LENT. Lent is a solemn period of penance, fasting and prayer for Catholics. It is a time to reflect on Jesus' sacrifice and prepare for the celebration of the resurrection. During Lent there are changes in the liturgy, such as omission of the *Gloria* and *Alleluia*, and the use of purple vestments. The Stations of the Way of the Cross, a devotional practice, is observed in our parishes.

How to Live Lent This Year: Lent is a kind of annual retreat for all Christians. We spiritually "venture into the desert" for forty days, just as Jesus did when he sought that quiet, alone place to prepare for his public ministry (Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-15, Luke 4:1-14). During Lent, we renew our life of faith and service for the coming year, and we prepare our hearts to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter. There are three tips to deepen your relationship with God during the 40 days of Lent. 1) Participate in the sacraments. 2) Help those in need around you. 3) Sacrifice something that's hard for you. *Lent 101: What It Is and Why It Matters - Christian Brothers University.*

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 60. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

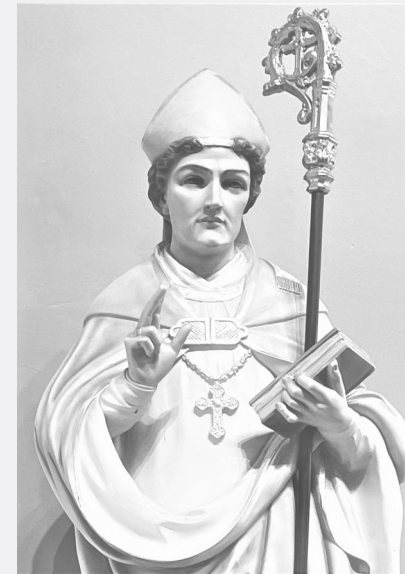
