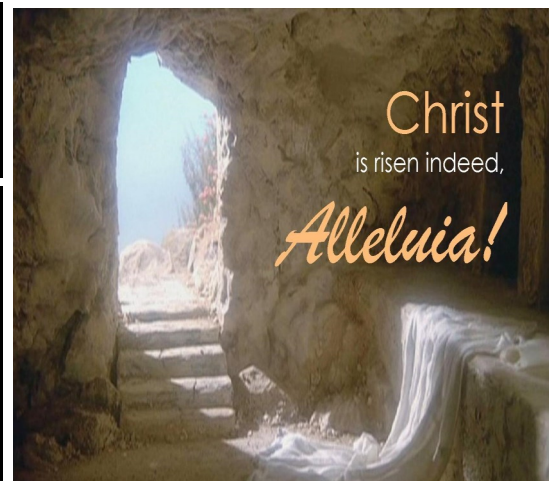

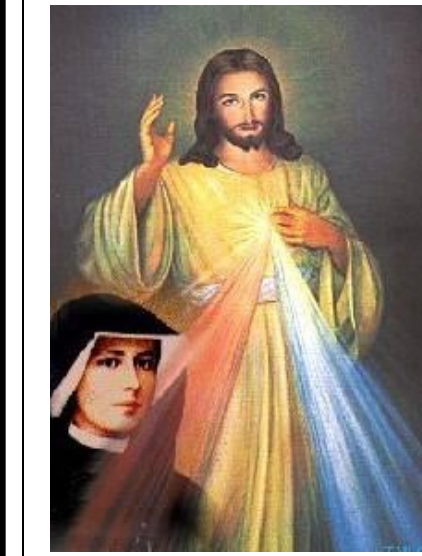
### PRAYER VIGIL FOR PEACE IN THE CONTEXT OF OF DIVINE MERCY CELEBRATION.

Pope Leo XIV has announced a Prayer Vigil for Peace on the evening before Divine Mercy Sunday. He is asking people around the world to take part in it, wherever they are. This is not limited to one country or one group. It is an invitation for anyone willing to pray.

"I invite everyone to join me in a prayer vigil for peace that we will celebrate here in Saint Peter's Basilica next Saturday, April 11," Pope Leo said.

The purpose is simple. The Church is calling people to pray for peace in a time when there is real conflict and division in the world. This includes war, tension between nations, and broken relationships in everyday life. The focus is not only on world leaders, but on each person.

Catholic teaching has always been clear that peace begins in the heart. Jesus teaches us to forgive, to love, and to turn away from sin. Without that, no political solution will last. This is why the Church turns to prayer first.



This vigil is placed right before Divine Mercy Sunday on purpose. Divine Mercy Sunday, connected to the revelations given to Saint Faustina Kowalska, reminds us that God's mercy is offered to everyone. The Church is asking people to receive that mercy and then live it.

This is not about doing something big or complicated. It can be as simple as stopping for a few minutes to pray, even one Hail Mary, with real attention and faith.

**THE DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY**, is observed on the octave day of Easter. This year 2026, the feast is celebrated April 12.

The feast was promoted by Saint Sister Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who kept a diary in the 1930s of Christ's private revelations telling her of His message of mercy. She wrote that she first saw a vision of Jesus on Feb. 22, 1931. He had rays of mercy streaming from His heart. Christ told her to have an image painted to represent the vision and to write below it, "Jesus, I trust in you!"

A PLENARY INDULGENCE, remitting all temporal punishment due to sin, is granted by the Catholic Church on Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter). To obtain it, one must fulfill three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions, while being detached from sin.
