If you know of parishioners who are shut-ins or in assisted living but would like a meal-plate delivered from the Bazaar, please inform the Parish Office.

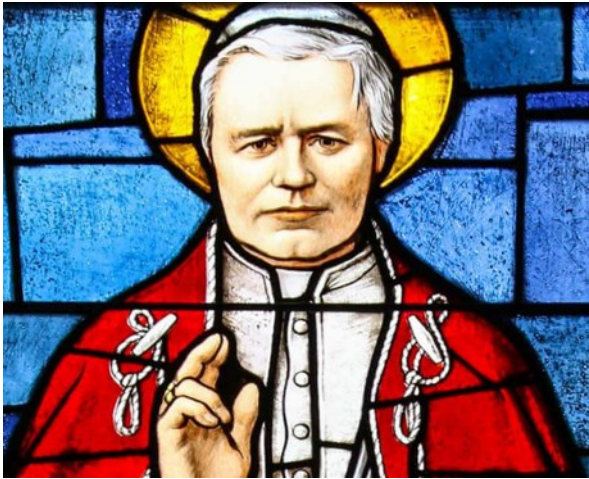

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - 2026 /2027 - IN OUR COMMUNITIES OF SAINT STANISLAUS IN CHAPPELL HILL, SAINT ANN IN SOMER-VILLE & BLESSED VIRGIN MARY IN OLD WASHINGTON. A patron saint of the Religious Education is Pope Saint Pius X.

*“After careful deliberationto bring about that children even from their tender years may be united to Jesus Christ, may live His life, and obtain protection from all danger of corruption, has deemed it needful to prescribe the following rules which are to be observed everywhere for the First Communion of children. 1. The age of discretion, both for Confession and for Holy Communion, is the time when a child begins to reason, that is about the seventh year, more or less. From that time on begins the obligation of fulfilling the precept of both **Confession and Communion**”~Quam Singulari, decision of Pope Saint Pius X, 1910.*

As pope, Saint Pius X took as his motto, “To restore all things in Christ” (Ephesians 1:10). Remaining as he was when he was a parish priest, spiritual director, and bishop, he was humble, simple, loved teaching children, and showed concern for the poor.

Most notably, his love for children and his long history of catechizing them led him to lower the age for First Holy Communion from twelve to seven, encouraging frequent reception of the Eucharist for them and all people. Deeply devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he often spoke of her and honored her. <https://mycatholic.life/saints/saints-of-the-liturgical-year/august-21-saint-pius-x-pope/>

In his catechetical approach Pius X authorized a simpler, localized catechism (initially for the Diocese of Rome) designed to be easily understood by children and adults alike.

Promoting Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD): He strongly encouraged and mandated religious instruction programs in every parish to combat religious ignorance among the youth. Even as pope, Saint Pious X routinely taught weekly catechism classes to children in the Vatican courtyard.

Don’t miss this: If your children (& youth) are not enrolled in the Catechism Classe, please do it as soon as you can. If you know of anybody from among the other members of your family or acquaintances let them know that we are still taking registration for the Religious Education Classes (CCE). Those of Chappell Hill area should enjoy the state of the art facilities in the Catholic Life Center. God is good. Saint Pious X pray for our Catechists, Students & their Parents. Amen.

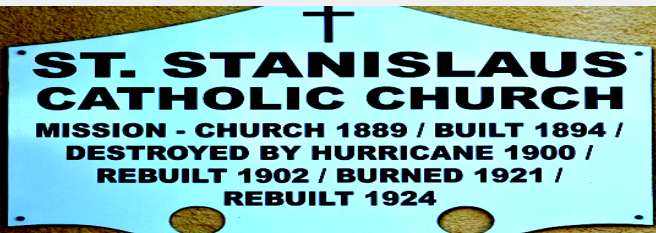
