**Holy Gospel Ewangelia for the 20th Sunday, Cycle A:**  
**"Woman, great is your faith!"**

The woman came, knelt at Jesus’ feet, and pleaded: "Lord, help me." Yet He replied: "It is not right to take the children’s bread and throw it to the dogs." She answered: "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters’ table." The perseverance of this woman—who refuses to give in to discouragement—offers a magnificent lesson in a living faith that translates into action.

**Saint Augustine** notes that this Canaanite woman "gives us an example of humility and a path of piety"[1]. At first, the Lord Jesus seems to pay her no heed, yet she "cried out to the Lord, who did not listen to her but was silently planning what He would do."

In those times, Jews contemptuously called Gentiles "dogs," as the dog was considered an unclean animal. Yet the words the Lord Jesus uses in reply seem very harsh: "It is not right to take the children’s bread and throw it to the dogs" (v. 26). Nevertheless, the woman does not lose her composure, nor does she betray any sign that these words have hurt her. "She renewed her request, and in the face of what seemed like an insult, she demonstrated her humility and obtained mercy."

Sometimes "we imagine," says **Saint Josemaría**, "that the Lord Jesus is not listening to us, that we are deluding ourselves and that only our own monologue is being heard. We feel bereft of earthly support and abandoned by heaven. (...) Let us fall to our knees with the persistence of the Canaanite woman, adoring Him and imploring: 'Lord, help me!' Then the darkness will vanish, conquered by the light of Love. (...) The Lord Jesus wants us to rely on Him in everything, and it is clear to us that without Him we can do nothing, whereas with Him we can do all things." <https://opusdei.org/pl-pl/gospel/komentarz-do-ewangelii-niewiasto-wielka-jest-twoja-wiara/>

... Then we have the Canaanite woman who interceded for her daughter, and when she was refused, persisted, and by the great noise she made, battered at the silence of Jesus. When he turned away from her, she followed him without apology; she humbly adored him when he rejected her; she listened patiently to his reproaches, and so, in the end, she brought forth *honey from the rock, and oil from the flinty stone* (Dt. 32:13). In the person of this woman, the church of the gentiles deserved to hear the Lord Jesus say: *O woman, great is your faith!....* John of Ford (died 1214 A.D.), abbot of a Cistercian monastery in southwest England.
