There will be an important meeting to finalize plans for the 100th Anniversary Celebration.

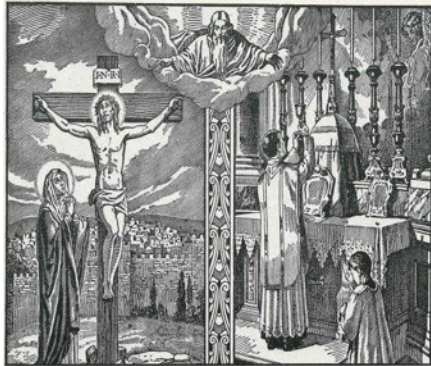
This meeting will be held after Mass on **Wednesday, July 15th. at 6:30 p.m.**, in the Parish Hall.

MONTH OF JULY IS DEDICATED TO THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS.

It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how He spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood.

But after the Second Vatican Council the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to

meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of His blood for humanity.

Christ's Precious Blood, like His Sacred Heart, is a symbol of His love for all mankind.

From time to time the faithful are asking **why is it that sometimes only priests drink from the cup, while other times the laity also drink?**

Bishop Ricken explains that, historically, the Church has limited distribution of the cup for doctrinal, practical and liturgical reasons. And on the doctrinal side, Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in both the Eucharistic Bread and Wine, which theologians refer to as the two "species" or "kinds" of the Eucharist. When you receive the consecrated host, you receive Jesus, including His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

If you drink from the cup as well, you're receiving the Eucharist under a second species, which is a great blessing, **but there's still only one Jesus, not two.**

Practically, it's relatively easier to spill the Precious Blood than to drop a consecrated host, and it's harder to purify. Finally, liturgically, during certain celebrations, the Church allows and encourages distribution of the Precious Blood to the laity.....all this reminds us not to take the Lord's sacrifice for granted. <https://stmarythevirgin.org/news/most-precious-blood-of-jesus>

Healed of the Wounds of Unbelief

It was not by accident that this chosen disciple [doubting Thomas] was missing [at the Lord's first appearance to all the assembled apostles], but by God's will. It was in the plans of the divine pity that by feeling the wounds in the flesh of his Teacher, the doubting disciple should heal in us the wounds of disbelief.

Thomas was difficult to convince....because he refused to believe without some sensible facts, not just from one sense but from two: sight — *unless I see the print of the nails in his hands*; and touch — *and put my hand into his side*. He was [also] unreasonable because he insisted on seeing the wounds before believing, although he would be seeing something greater, that is, the entire person risen and restored. And although Thomas said these things because of his own doubts, this was arranged by God for our benefit and progress. It is certain that Christ, who arose as a complete person, could have healed the marks of his wounds; but he kept them for our benefit.
