We are now in the Season of Lent.

No dances during Lent.

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at age 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-60. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which Fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other acts of penance or charity.
4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.

MARCH IS A MONTH DEDICATED TO SAINT JOSEPH

St. Teresa of Avila wrote in her Autobiography (VI, 11-12): "Would that I could persuade all men to be devoted to glorious Saint Joseph, for I know by long experience what blessings he can obtain for us from God. I have never known anyone who was truly devoted to him and honored him by particular services who did not advance greatly in virtue: for he helps in a special way those souls who commend themselves to him.
