AUGUST 9TH IS A FEAST DAY OF SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS,



also known as Edith Stein. She is a Catholic saint who was born Jewish but later converted to Christianity and became a Carmelite nun. She was murdered by the Nazis in the Auschwitz concentration camp on August 9, 1942. She is also a patron saint of Europe.

Edith Stein was born in 1891 in Breslau, then under Germany (now Wrocław, Poland), into a Jewish family. She was a brilliant student and became a renowned philosopher, studying under <u>Edmund Husserl</u>. She initially rejected religion but later, through her intellectual and spiritual journey, was drawn to Christianity, eventually being baptized in 1922.

After her conversion, she continued her academic work, but felt a strong call to religious life.

Along the way she studied with Christian intellectuals. She was particularly influenced by the faith of the widow of a friend and professor, Adolf Reinach, who was killed in World War I. At age 30, in 1921, she picked up the autobiography of Saint Teresa of Avila in a friend's library and couldn't put it down. "This is the truth!" she told herself upon completing the book. After buying a prayer book and a catechism she approached a parish priest, and asked for baptism, only to be met with hesitation. The parish priest could not believe that she would know the faith without catechism classes. Stein then requested the priest test her, and she was baptized on January 1,

1922. Soon after her Baptism, she wanted to enter religious life and she entered the Carmelite order in 1934, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

As a Jew and a convert to Catholic faith, she faced persecution under the Nazi regime. In 1942, on August 9th she and her sister Rosa, were killed in the gas chambers of Auschwitz

<u>Pope John Paul II</u> canonized Edith Stein in 1998. In 1999, she was declared one of the six co-patron saints of Europe. Her feast day is celebrated on August 9th.

Edith Stein is remembered as a philosopher, a woman of faith, and a martyr. Her life and death are seen as a powerful symbol of the dangers of religious and racial persecution.

The writings of Edith Stein fill 17 volumes, many of which have been translated into English. A woman of integrity, she followed the truth wherever it led her. After becoming a Catholic, Edith continued to honor her mother's Jewish faith. Sister Josephine Koeppel, O.C.D., translator of several of Edith's books, sums up this saint with the phrase, "Learn to live at God's hands."
