ON JUNE 29 WE CELEBRATE THE SOLEMNITY OF SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL, THE APOSTLES.

We celebrate the feast day of two great men, Peter and Paul. They were sent by God to announce the Good News of salvation in Jesus. To accomplish their mission, Peter and Paul were willing to make any sacrifice, even to the extent of giving their very lives, as Jesus did, to announce to people God's offer of salvation in Jesus.

In the first two readings *Acts 12:1-11* & *2Tm 4:6-8, 17-18*, each Apostle gives a beautiful, stirring testimony of how God rescued him from the hands of his enemies. In the gospel, Jesus promises to Peter that the Church of Jesus would never be destroyed. With God's help, the Church will continue, despite human failings, under the guidance of Peter and the apostles and their successors. The Church of Jesus is built on God's power and revelation, not on human strength and insight: "Blest are you, Simon son of Jonah! No mere man has revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father" (Mt 16:17).

Jesus is the founder of the Church in two ways. First, Jesus began the Church 2,000 years ago. Jesus is also founder in the sense that he continues to send his Spirit on the Church throughout history and at this very moment in time. As Peter and Paul preached salvation in Jesus, they were very aware of this continuing, dynamic presence of the risen Jesus in their midst.

As members of Catholic and Apostolic Church, we proclaim to our brothers and sisters that the same risen Jesus is present among us as we celebrate the Eucharist today. We rejoice because Jesus continues to act in the Church to give needed strength and lasting life to us who accept him as our Savior. We greet our Lord here in our midst: "You are the Messiah . . . the Son of the living God!" (Mt 16:16).

It is also good to remember why the Church of Rome is so distinct, so prominent in Christianity. The answer is, because it was founded on the testimony (martyrdom) of these two Apostles, Saint Peter and Saint Paul.

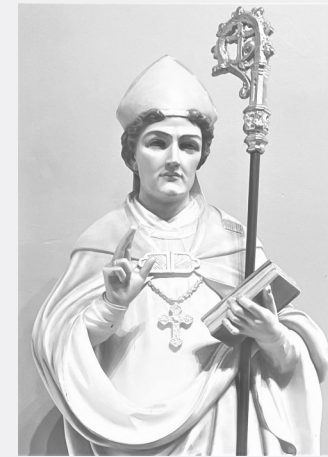
Beads of Peace
