2023 Missionary Cooperation Plan

Reach out to Peru's Poor: On June 24-25, Sister Mary Ann Nestel, CSJ will speak at the Masses on behalf of the Sisters of St. Joseph that work among the families living in poverty in Peru. Currently, donations are used to give food to those who come to the convent asking for food, and groceries to groups of women that cook meals for those who have nothing to eat. Inflation, the Covid deaths of family breadwinners, and unemployment make it difficult for families to put food on the table. In addition, small stipends are given to five university students who help tutor children at the convent in Canto Chico, Peru.

Small stipends are also given to women that have attended workshops so they can start their own small businesses to feed their families. The needs of the people far outweigh the donations available to help the poor. Your prayers are requested for the Sisters of St. Joseph and the people of Peru. Your generosity will be greatly appreciated in the collection for Peru during the Mass.

JUNE A MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS (continued from last week)
THE 12 PROMISES OUR SAVIOR REVEALED TO
SAINT MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE.

Jesus Made Twelve Promises to Those Who Hold a True Devotion to His Sacred Heart:



1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life. 2. I will give peace in their families and will unite families that are divided. 3. I will console them in all their troubles.

4. I will be their refuge during life and above all in death. 5. I will bestow the blessings of Heaven on all their enterprises. 6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.

7. Tepid souls shall become fervent. 8. Fervent souls shall rise quickly to great perfection. 9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored and will imprint My love on the hearts of those who would wear this image on their person. I will also destroy in them all disordered movements.

10. I will give to priests who are animated by a tender devotion to my Divine Heart the gift of touching the most hardened hearts. 11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart, never to be effaced. 12. THE GREATEST PROMISE - I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who communicate (Receive Holy Communion) on the First Friday in nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence: they will not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their Sacraments. My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

It is important to note in order to obtain the GREAT PROMISE that the Nine Fridays must be made in honor of Christ's Sacred Heart, meaning, practicing devotion and having great love of His Sacred Heart. They must be on the first Friday of the month for nine consecutive months, and Holy Communion must be received. If one were to start on a First Friday and not keep the others then one would have to start over.

Many great sacrifices must be made in order to obtain this final promise, but the grace when receiving Holy Communion on First Friday's is indescribable!
