SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST & THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION 2025. Sacrament of Confirmation will take place at Saint Mary's Immaculate Conception Church in Brenham this Sunday June 8<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 PM. Please pray for all the young people from our parishes, who are about to be baptized. Try also to refresh you knowledge of the catechism in regard to Solemnity of Pentecost (Descent of the Holy Spirit) and Confirmation. For example, you need to know the following: 1. Who is the Holy Spirit? Holy Spirit is the third person of the Blessed Trinity who proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit is equal to the Father and the Son. 2. What is Confirmation? Confirmation is the Sacrament which gives you the strength to be a good Catholic. This Sacrament completes and perfects the Christian life you begin at Baptism, namely: a) Confirmation gives you more Sanctifying Grace...b) It gives you more strength to stay away from sin and lead a Christian life...c) It helps you to be a loyal and faithful follower of Jesus Christ...d) It gives you the strength to profess your Catholic Faith openly and not to hide it. 3. Can you get to Heaven without Confirmation? Yes, but it is more difficult. 4. Is it a sin to neglect Confirmation? Yes, it is a sin to neglect Confirmation. 5. Who gives Confirmation? Usually a bishop. 6. What do you have to do to receive Confirmation worthily? a) You have to be a baptized Catholic, and...b)have no mortal sin on your soul; c) have an intention to receive it...You should also be well instructed in the Catholic religion. 7. Do you have to have a sponsor for Confirmation? Yes, but not the same one you had for Baptism. 8. How many times can you be confirmed? Only once. 9. What is expected of a confirmed Catholic? A confirmed Catholic, by his prayers and words and good example, should try to lead others to the True Church. 10. How is Confirmation given? In the traditional rite, the Bishop, holding his hands over those to be confirmed, prays for them and then makes the Sign of the Cross on the forehead of each one with the holy oil of Chrism. He then offers each person a sign of peace and the newly confirmed person answers: "And with vour spirit".

There are Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom - to desire the things of God and to direct our whole life to the His honor and glory. Understanding - to know more clearly the mysteries of our Faith. Counsel - warns us of the deceits of the devil, and of dangers to salvation. Fortitude - the strength to do the will of God. Knowledge - to discover the will of God in all things. Piety - to love God and obey Him because we love Him. Fear of the Lord - to acknowledge the awesome power and holiness of God and consequently, to dread our sins. And there are twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit. The Baltimore Catechism explains what they are: Charity - Love of God and our neighbor, Joy - happiness born of the spirit, not of worldly pleasures, Peace - with God, because we are His friends; and man, because we deal justly and kindly with all; and ourselves, because we have a good conscience, Benignity - the attitude to show goodness and kindness, Goodness - the internalizing of holiness in ourselves, Longanimity - Patience with God, our neighbor, and ourselves. Modesty - Humility and purity in our behavior and appearance, Continence - Self-control and temperance, Chastity - Purity from sexual sins in thought, word, and deed. # SAINT STANISLAUS MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE ASSIGNMENT 2025 **IS PETER UNIVERSITY ACHINA/ONNEH IN NIGERIA.**

Next weekend we will be blessed to host two Priests natives of Nigeria: Father. Emmanuel C. Umezinwa – Professor of Peter University & Father Uche E. Obikwelu presently a Pastor of Kingland, Texas. They will be counting on our generosity. Peter University is a Catholic institution owned by the two dioceses of Awka and Ekwulobia in the Southeastern state of Anambra, Nigeria. The gates opened for the first time on October 3, 2023. So far, there are 350 students: all living on campus. The reason for the university lies in history, necessity, and the *Missionary Mandate of* the Church to "go and teach" (Mt 28:19). After the genocidal war against Biafra (1967-1970), the federal government annexed Catholic schools in Nigeria and expelled all Christian missionaries who worked in Biafra land. After forty years of poor school policies and management, the consequences became unbearable for the nation. Rebuilding the values and culture that make us human became a necessity for the Church as she politically and legally demanded that all her schools be returned. This was done in 2011 in Anambra state under the leadership of Governor Peter Obi. Anambra State has taken the front position in education ever since. This Impressive outcome was apparent in the secondary school level. But on graduation, the students would secure admission into government-owned and badly run universities and colleges. The Church, therefore, after a careful study of the situation, thought that continuity at the tertiary level should receive priority attention as part of the missionary mandate. Peter University was the answer for the two dioceses of Awka and Ekwulobia. Attention to disadvantaged, physically challenged and poor but very bright students have a pride of place in the university's agenda. This is the reason for soliciting scholarships, endowments, funding of facilities and equipment, capacity building, training in advocacy, ICT apprenticeship and knowledge sharing so that education, science and technology can raise up a people purposely held down by an invading Islamist government with some overt international support. https://youtu.be/BiKcr0haZBQ
